

Background to SDG 16

- Without peace, stability, human rights and effective governance, based on the rule of law - we cannot hope for sustainable development. High levels of armed violence and insecurity have a destructive impact on a country's development, affecting economic growth. Sexual violence, crime, exploitation and torture are also prevalent where there is conflict or no rule of law, and countries must take measures to protect those who are most at risk.
- The SDGs aim to significantly reduce all forms of violence, and work with governments and communities to find lasting solutions to conflict and insecurity. Strengthening the rule of law and promoting human rights is key to this process, as is strengthening the participation of developing countries in the institutions of global governance.



Nexus between Peace and Development

- Sustaining peace is not only an enabler but also a fundamental outcome of sustainable development, as the two notions are mutually reinforcing. This point is acutely manifest in conflictaffected countries, where opportunities for development are lost as both governments and people are struggling for survival and existence. Not only that, very often conflict and unrest can reverse gains made in development.
- This is why when a country is in conflict, we need to join force to help it get out of the conflict, and when a country is emerging from conflict, we need to assist it to rebuild its nation and reconstruct its economy.


